All scheduled hearings will be held by teleconference or other electronic means. If you have any questions, please contact the Kayenta Judicial District Court.

To pay any fine or fee, mail a money order payable to the "Navajo Nation" to: Tuba City District Court, P.O. Box 725, Tuba City, AZ 86045. Include citation/court document and contact information. All fines or fees mailed will be processed as received on the postmarked date. Payments for civil traffic fines only may be paid online through <https://www.justiceweb.navajo-nsn.gov/>.
